Potton Town Teas – is moving to every Thursday morning, between 10am and 12 noon, as from 17th September: It's a friendly community drop-in at the Community Centre, Brook End, all are welcome. Come and join us for a game of Scrabble, Triominoes or cards, or simply sit and chat over tea and homemade cakes. During October, the over 60s can pop in and collect their free 'Get Ready for Winter' items.

Free section timers for the over 60s – don't come home to a dark house this autumn! These timers can be used to bring on a light at a set time and help give the impression an empty home is occupied. This can help give you peace of mind when you are on holiday or in hospital. They have been kindly donated by Bedfordshire Police Partnership Trust.

Winter Fuel Payment – if you were born before 5th January 1953, then you are entitled to get your Winter Fuel Payment of between \pounds 100 and \pounds 300. Many men are missing out on this payment, as they are yet to reach state pensionable age, but are over 62. Call Andrea to find out if you qualify.

Warm Home Discount - are you eligible to claim a £140 discount off your electricity bill? The Warm Home Discount Scheme is running again through winter 2015-2016. If you get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit, you will automatically qualify. However, many electricity suppliers offer the discount to pensioners on a low annual household income, approx £16,190. You will have to apply directly to your electricity supplier to claim. Call Andrea to find out if your supplier is part of the scheme and for help applying.

Samsung Tablet Training – we are continuing to train up small groups of Potton over 60s residents to teach them how to use a computer tablet. The waiting list for an allotment is currently very small, unfortunately we are unable to advise when a plot will become available. Please don't be put off by the waiting list as people's circumstances often change and some people always leave the waiting list or no longer want a plot when they are offered one.

Hall Hire - Availability at the Community Centre and Mill Lane Pavilion

There is a large hall at the Community Centre in Brook End with a kitchen. There is also a carpeted upstairs hall 5 meters square with kitchen facilities. The upper hall is suited to smaller meetings and group events. There are a number of vacant sessions during the day time and at weekends at the Community Centre, give Mrs. Williamson a call during office opening hours to see if either of the halls would be suitable for your group or function. The Community Centre is near to Potton Market Square for the bus route and shopping and a free car park is very nearby.

The Pavilion at Mill Lane has a large 9 metre square hall and kitchen, there are facilities for people with disabilities and a baby changing unit. The floor may not be suitable for dance groups. We have a large free to use car park. If you are planning your child's Birthday party, the Pavilion at Mill Lane may well be the ideal location

Play areas - Hardwood Chips

In April 2015, 12 cubic metres of additional Hardwood Chips were installed for the aerial runway at Mill Lane Playing Fields. In July 2015, 7.5 cubic metres of additional Hardwood Chips have been installed in the young children's multi unit area at Henry Smith Playing Fields. An additional 16.5 cubic metres of Hardwood Chips have been ordered to be installed in the older children's multi unit area at Henry Smith Playing Fields. DOGS - MILL LANE PLAYING FIELDS

You may be aware that Central Bedfordshire Council establish four dog control orders, which came into effect on 19 October 2014, with the aim to cut down the amount of dog foul, restrict dogs from places such as enclosed children's playgrounds and ensure that dog owners keep their dogs on leads in certain areas including cemeteries and marked sports pitches. At the town council meeting on the 21st July 2015 the Town Council discussed again about a request for dogs to be banned from Mill Lane Playing Fields and the council resolved that the Playing Fields, Allotments and Burials Committee discuss about fencing off an area for dog walkers at the next meeting. The Playing Fields, Allotments and Burials Committee will be meeting on the 6th October 2015 in the Community Centre, Brook End.

Car Park - Mill Lane

At the town council meeting on the 7th July 2015 the Town Council resolved to install a Physical Barrier to prevent unauthorised use of Mill Lane Pavilion Car Park.

Focus on Security Stay Safe at Home

Most burglaries are committed by opportunist thieves and can be prevented by you thinking about the security of your home and belongings:

- Fit good quality deadlocks to all exterior doors, including garages and sheds.
- Fit frame locks, especially on ground floor windows and patio doors.
- Don't leave any tools or toys outside the house that could be used to break a window or lever a door.
- Think about where you store your wheelie bins can they be used as climbing aids?
- Mark or etch your property with your postcode, house/flat number or the first three letters of your house name.
- Register your valuables for free at www.immobilise.com
- Store your house keys and car keys out of sight in your home never leave them near a door, a letterbox or window.
- Consider installing a visible burglar alarm and remember to set it when you go out or to bed at night.



- Prevent easy access to the back and sides of your home by installing lockable gates, two metre minimum fencing or walls. Trellis topping also makes climbing difficult.
- Use automatic timer-switches to turn on lights and perhaps a radio to make it look like someone's home, even if you are just going out for a couple of hours.
- Make sure you know the identity of the person you are letting into your home - never open the door if you are in doubt or feel anxious about the caller.
