## **CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL REPORT**

#### From Anita Lewis representing you the people of Potton

A year on - the first year of the unitary Council. I think a certain amount of congratulation is in order.

Two districts and just over half a County Council were "grafted" together in what appeared to the public to be a seamless operation. The schools still opened, the waste was still collected and the buses still operated. The exercise to place (or displace) hundreds of staff was enormous. The transition process is still ongoing and will be for sometime yet. The harmonisation of salaries alone was a task of monumental proportions.

The disaggregation of assets has only just been agreed on roughly a 60/40 ratio and now the urgent task is to find appropriate accommodation for our 3,000 staff in Central Bedfordshire. We still have hundreds of staff in County Hall/Borough Hall renamed. As a interim measure we have rented Technology House on the Ampthill Road in Bedford for four years to enable us to bring teams together. I know in Children's services, I have staff in Priory Park, Borough Hall, Melbourne House, Pilgrim House, Chicksands, Dunstable offices, Vernon Court, The Old Court House Dunstable, Biggleswade and I am sure I have missed some.

The Dunstable offices are being "revamped" – internal walls taken down so that another 300 staff can be accommodated there. Chicksands was a superb building for the District Council but needs to be expanded if more officers and visitors are to be accommodated there. It is the administration headquarters and the Chief Executive and Directors Of Services are sited there. Having said all that, there is a tremendous spirit of belonging to Central Bedfordshire Council. The new Chief Executive Richard Carr although only a recent arrival has already demonstrated his leadership qualities and is rapidly making his mark.

It is just bad luck that the birth of the new unitary Council has coincided with the worst recession most of us can remember.

At a time when we would want to enhance and improve services, statutory functions have to be given priority over the discretionary ones even though the latter are sometimes the ones the public appreciate most.

Hard financial choices and decisions have had to be made causing displeasure with sectors of the community- here I am thinking of my own area at the moment which is school transport where we spend £8.10 million. In order to obtain a balanced budget we need to save £1 million from this budget. The new school transport policy has been out for consultation and goes to the Executive Committee for decision March 9th. Parents who have received free transport to date are upset that they may have to pay their own bus fares should they choose to send children to schools outside their catchment area. The Council is revenue poor (only 30% comes in grants from Central Government 70% from local rates) We do not want to put up Council Tax cannot put it up or we will be capped. Other local authorities, even Bedford get much bigger grant from Central Government. Our new Chief Executive came from Wolverhampton where it is almost the exact opposite. 70% from Central Government and 30% raised locally. As I said, revenue poor but capital rich County farm lands and buildings which can be utilised when the markets improve to provide the services our inhabitants require.

It follows that we must keep capital spending down until such time as the markets improve. This is not a time to be borrowing money, the interest for which has to be paid out of the already overstretched revenue budget.

Better financial times do lie ahead and this is the message from Central Bedfordshire. For the moment the task is to provide services to the best standards possible, to avoid waste and make every penny count.

The future is bright for Central Bedfordshire and even in these times of financial constraint optimism runs high that value for money is being given and a good level of services provided for our residents.

## COUNCIL TAX

For several years Potton Town Council has, by careful budgeting, not requested any increase in the precept. Now increasing costs of utilities, government legislation and new facilities mean that this year an increase of £4.62 per household for the year has had to be made to the Town Council's portion of your Council Tax. The Council will do all in its power to keep future costs to the minimum whilst continuing to provide and striving to improve services.

The Town Council provides a public office for help and advice, allotments, public conveniences, two playing fields, two playgrounds, council chambers, cemetery and St Mary's church yard, free car park, two community halls, bus shelters and market square, floral displays, notice boards, a web site, councillor surgeries, newsletter, Christmas lights, funding for local groups and support for the town plan.

The Town Council looks after the Cemetery, the Allotments, the Henry Smith Playground, the Mill Lane Playground, the Recreation Fields, the Public Conveniences, the Brook End Car Park, the Pavilion and the Community Centre.
