

Chairman's Report APRIL 2012

It seems a long time now since Christmas but it has to be said that the lights display in the Market Square over the festive period was better than ever. We received many glowing comments from the community and thanks go to the volunteers and donors who make it all possible. We will continue to upgrade the systems over the coming year.

Consultation continues over the Biggleswade Road development site and a questionnaire has recently been distributed to all households seeking views on the need for a community hall for all. I would encourage you to complete and return this form so that interest can be gauged and an informed decision can be made regarding the feasibility of such a scheme.

The Council has spent much time recently addressing the problem of HGVs using unsuitable roads in Potton, often illegally. A lot of the problem stems from inaccurate data in sat navs. Representations have been made to the highways authority for better signage and stricter enforcement of traffic violations in the affected areas.

On a final note it is disappointing that we are receiving an increasing number of complaints about dog fouling. It is of particular concern that the worst affected areas are the play areas and football fields where many young children are present. Also the alleyways used by families to access the recreational areas seem to suffer. Increased patrols by the dog warden are taking place and action will be taken against offenders who do not clean up after their dog. Disposal bins are placed in strategic areas around the town. Please use them.

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL REPORT

Since the Unitary council was formed in May 2011 the role of a councillor has increased, in this report I will give you a brief run down of some of the Committees & Boards I represent.



POLICE: Bedfordshire authority will be joining forces with Hertfordshire & Cambridgeshire in November 2012. Criminal actions along with patrolling of the rural areas will continue to be of a high priority. The election procedure for the new police Commissioner can be found on the police web site. Candidates will be declared very soon with an election to follow.

BOUNDARY CHANGES: The Boundary commission has recommended Potton be joined with North Hertfordshire, However C .B.C. has produced a boundary plan to keep Potton ward in North East Bedfordshire., This has been presented to the commission. It has my full support. I met with Oliver Heald, the M.P. for N.E. Hertforshire. He promised if these changes occur he will give all the help we may need.

SCHOOLS AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES: As you are aware there are many changes with this service. The greatest is the formation of Trusts, Pyramids, and Clusters, The transaction is being very closely monitored making sure that our children achieve the best results possible.



LIBRARIES: No closures are to take place, the question is, do you have any thoughts on how to improve or bring in other services to enhance this facility? If you have any thoughts or ideas please contact:

SWIFT BOXES

There was a stall at the Seasonal Market in March encouraging people to help to provide more homes for our local colony of swifts. Many nesting sites were lost when the old foundry was demolished. If you missed the stall you can contact the RSPB to



find out how to help. The Town Council is hoping to be able to provide nesting places around the Clock House in the Market Square. The Council has been informed that an area where homes are particularly needed is along Shannon Place which is an area in which the colony who live around the Red Lion like to fly.

POTTON TOWN PLAN

Spring 2012

The committees of the Town Plan are very active at the present time, particularly as a result of the generosity of Potton Consolidated Charity.

Shopping

There was another Seasonal Market held on the 24th March with a Fairtrade theme. The committee is striving to obtain Fairtrade status for Potton. It has been donated monies from the Charity to purchase some new metal stalls for the market together with some barrows for moving them



around. Several other pieces of equipment have been purchased. Please note the next Seasonal Market will be on the 23rd June.

Associated with this committee is the group trying to establish a community orchard in the Town.

Sports & Leisure

The charity has donated monies to purchase an adult outside gym that is



proposed to be erected in the Henry Smith Playing fields this summer. The committee is also arranging for some new benches to be installed in the Mill Lane sports field. In addition we are involved in the replacement of most of the play equipment in the Henry Smith field again from monies from the Charity.

Environment Group

The group is very active and has recently had days to clear the banks of the Brook to improve the habitat for the Water Voles that live there. The group is now involved with Sustrans in a project to constuct a cycle path from Potton to the RSPB. The feasibility study has been funded by the Charity. PCC has also funded a project to issue a leaflet of walks around Potton to every household. A further project to install interpretation boards along the walks is being looked at in conjunction with the History Society.

It has been a pleasure to see the bulbs that were planted on the approach roads to Potton springing back to life this year.

Community Safety

The committee continues to meet and has attended several Markets and Shows to publicise its aims and achievements.

Housing

There have been a number of meetings with the developers regarding the proposed new houses on the land east of the Biggleswade Road (between the Garage and the Hollow). The Developers are hoping to obtain outline Planning permission for 150 houses, 2 ½ acres of Industrial land and a new Community Hall. It is planned to have a Public Consultation in April when you can give your opinion.

Hall for All

This committee is very active at the moment with meetings with the Developers and Central Beds trying to understand if a new Hall is a feasible proposition. Hopefully you have completed the questionnaire regarding your views on this and met with committee members at the recent Market.

Traffic

Several members of the Town Council have been around with a Speed Indicator to try and slow down the traffic going in and out of the Town. This should be taken seriously as if caught it may lead to a prosecution. The Traffic group have recently undertaken a review of current weight restrictions for lorries passing through the town.

Young People

The Charity has again been very generous and agreed to fund a Youth Worker for one night a week for people aged 12 to 18. The Youth Club will be held in the Mill Lane Pavilion on a Thursday evening 7pm until 9.30pm starting in May this year. We have funding to run this for a 3 year period. Watch for further announcements regarding the opening.

TOWN COUNCILLOR PROFILE



In the hot seat this spring is Councillor Paul Rogers

I am 56 years old and have been selected by the Town Council to join them as a councillor.

I work for a local metal supply company in Biggleswade and moved to Potton in 2009 from Barnet in North London, where I was a local councillor for 8 years.

I started this involvement in working in the local community when I was 13 years old at my local youth club. I represented this club on the local youth forum that regularly met with local councillors in planning youth provision. I have also been a youth leader and chair of my local community centre. I was a school governor on 3 local schools for over 15 years.

HEAVY GOODS VEHICLES

There is a weight restriction in much of Potton and unless large vehicles are making a delivery they should not be in the weight restricted area. This illegal activity creates difficulties for other traffic and our roads are not suited to these heavy goods vehicles. Property has been damaged repeatedly and the situation is unacceptable. To help to combat this problem, please report the name of the company (often on the side of the vehicle) and the registration number to the Police. If you also give the details to the Council it might be possible to build up a picture of the main offenders and contact the haulage company.

DOG WALKERS



Unfortunately the Council has again received many complaints about dog faeces being left on the pavements, along causeways, and footpaths and even in the children's play areas. As the Chairman has asked in his report please use the many dog litter bins provided for this purpose. Please do not leave dog faeces to be a danger to children. Please clean up after your dog.

COMMUNITY HALL

There have been attempts to build a Community Hall before, without success. A Steering Group of interested organisations has been set up to work on a feasibility study and business plan with the developers and Central Bedfordshire Council. Potton already has over five thousand people living here and if the proposed housing developments go ahead, we would like community facilities to keep up with the growing population and support all the sports and cultural activities we enjoy.

That's why a questionnaire was delivered to every household in Potton to ask whether there are individuals who may be interested in setting up a club e.g. badminton, ball room dancing, martial arts or special interest, or whether you feel there is a need for a community hall large enough to provide private parties, wedding receptions etc. This may be the last opportunity to provide a Community Hall suitable for all our residents, whatever their age or interests. In 2008, 46% of respondents to the Potton Town Plan said there was a need for a larger self-financing hall in Potton. We would like to test this with further public consultation.

We plan to use your responses to produce an outline plan for public consultation in April (details will be in The Chronicle) which will show whether we have a sustainable business plan for the future of the hall. That's why we need to know your views and that there is sufficient demand for this proposal. Even if you don't want a new hall to be built, it would be helpful to know why.

HALL HIRE AVAILABILITY AT THE COMMUNITY CENTRE AND THE PAVILION

There is a large 14 x 3.5 metre hall at the Community Centre in Brook End with a kitchen. There is also a carpeted upstairs hall 5 meters square with kitchen facilities. The upper hall is suited to smaller meetings and group events.

There are a number of vacant sessions during the day time and at weekends at the **Community Centre**, give Sarah a call to see if either of the halls would be suitable for your group or function. The centre is near to Potton Market Square for the bus route and shopping and a car park is very nearby.

The Pavilion at Mill Lane has a large 9 metre square hall and kitchen and there are facilities for people with disabilities. The floor may not be suitable for dance groups. This hall has some space for weekend functions.
