I have been on the town council for about half of my time in the town and have served in various roles including chair of the Finance Committee and previously as Chairman of the Town Council.

I would like to welcome Chris Temple, Les Ivall and Roger Jordan who have joined us recently as Councillors.

This is another year when Party on Potton was in operation during the August bank holiday weekend. This has proved to be a great weekend in the past and this year was a great success. The reduced Committee has worked very hard over the last two years raising both funds and the profile of the event. Many events were planned for all ages and ranges, many with free participation.



Earlier in the year we had a sports day event in the Henry Smith playing fields organised by our independent Central Bedfordshire Councillor Adam Zerny. It was attended by several sports groups from the town and surrounding areas who encouraged many people to take up a sporting activity from bowls and athletics and the martial arts, which will obviously be beneficial from a health point of view. People have complained for a while about "boy racers" speeding through the town. As a result of input from the Town Plan Committee the speed watch programme is doing very well. This operation has volunteers checking the speed of traffic through the town and registering those that are exceeding the limits. Offenders may receive a letter of warning from the police if they have been noted. A pro-active plan to keep our town streets safer.

The Town Plan Committee has also been able to secure the services of the Citizens Advice Bureau in the town. Anyone wishing to make an appointment to discuss any matter with them need to ring the dedicated appointment line **01525 404715**.

In these austere times we must all look after our finances. Your Town Council is no different, in fact we must be extra vigilant with public money and ensure that we obtain good value for money at every opportunity. The past few years has seen the money available to the Town Council reduced in real terms for various reasons. Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) are withholding grant monies due to Town and Parish councils that the National Government have said should be paid. This is several thousands of pounds that the Town Council could and should put to good use for the benefit of the people in the town. We have tried to keep the annual increase in the town's share of the council tax to a minimum to ensure the least burden on the tax payers. Unfortunately having to take on more responsibilities that CBC are not willing to cover, an increase in the precept will be inevitable next year.

This is the growing season and many gardens look beautiful at this time of year but please remember the hedges. Sometimes they can grow wild outside the garden and cause obstructions on the pathways, so please remember to trim the outside as well as in the garden.

It always takes a while for Councils and Government to catch up with the modern world and this is currently apparent on the subject of social media. The Town Council set up its own website some time ago and has an official twitter account, both of which are currently under review. There has been some confusion recently over the "YOU POTTON" Facebook page. This is not an official Potton Town Council page and should not be viewed as such. The town council is considering setting up a Facebook account. When it does it will be launched and advertised through your newsletter and possibly the local paper.

To finish this article I would like to appeal to all members of our community to think about the future of the town and what direction they would like to see it take. Next April will mark a critical point for social care in England, with the pooling of £5.4 billion from councils and the health service in an attempt to support the new Care plan.
