

A number of roads in Potton have been resurfaced by the County Council during 2008. A resident celebrated with his own flag when Brook End was repaired recently. He tells me that




the road had not been resurfaced for over 40 years. It did create some inconvenience for two days but the contractors have done a splendid job at Brook End.
