

Chairman's Message

This is the first letter of 2009 and if the current situation is an indication it will be a busy year. Large projects such as the town centre enhancement and the town plan are well advanced.

The town centre enhancement is all but complete, only the final finishing touches are now needed. Small trees are still to be sited and benches around the large trees in the centre will be fitted very soon. I believe it has improved the look of our town centre a great deal and will delight visitors to our town for many years.

The town plan steering committee have formed individual smaller committees to study the results of the questionnaire distributed throughout the town. Using this information they will formulate action plans to address the problems raised and any ideas that have resulted. These individual plans will be forwarded to the steering committee who will use them when producing the final town plan. The steering committee will attempt to publish an interim progress report in the near future to keep the residents informed.

The Beds Rural Charities (BRCC) are running a housing needs survey which is a central government initiative. This is in addition to the section in our questionnaire and is to ascertain if there is a need for particular types of housing. Some of the information will be a duplication of information you have given in the questionnaire but I would encourage you to complete the form and return it as some exchange of ideas could result to our benefit.

The Christmas lights were once again a success. I think everyone was pleased to see Santa arrive on a steam engine escorted by Noddy and Big Ears. Next year could be even more fun.

Much has been written in the press recently on the remuneration of local councillors. With the inception of the new Central Beds unitary authority all the expenses and payments have obviously had to be reviewed. Members of Potton town council act as your representatives and endeavour to do this to the best benefit of the residents of Potton. They do this on a voluntary basis. No councillor acting as a Potton town councillor receives any payment. They are entitled to receive out of pocket expenses but to my knowledge since I have been associated with the town council no expense claim has ever been submitted by any councillor. This may be reflected in the fact that for yet another year Potton town council have not increased their proportion of your council tax.

At long last we have managed to have a seat placed in Station Road for the benefit of those walking the long uphill distance from the town centre to the Newtown/Paddocks end of the town. Our thanks go to the landladies in the Red Lion for their assistance in providing a site for the bench and Mr. Utting for his work in campaigning on this issue.

Finally I would inform you that the town's annual meeting will take place on Monday 20th April in the pavilion at Mill Lane. Hope to see a good turnout of residents.
