

### **ANNUAL TOWN MEETING 2007**

### **Chairman's Report**

It is my pleasure to give my report for the year from the date of the last up to this Town Meeting .Whether this time next year I again do so or am even on the Town Council remains to be seen. My fate and that of eighteen others rests with you and all other registered electors of our Town. When I penned an item in our Spring Newsletter I was hopeful but not over optimistic that I would be able to trigger enough interest in the Town council activities to bring forward new faces prepared to influence decisions to benefit our residents. The result is a contest for the first time since the early 1980's and we are assured of at least three new councillors as that number are not seeking re-election on 3rd May.

The election to the Council is held every four years and normally would be concurrent with the District Council election which would lead to the cost borne by the Town being greatly reduced. While since the last contest the cost has not been incurred, this time by a paradox the full amount will be borne by us as there is no contest for the District. I do hope that there is a very large turnout at the poll.

On perusal of my report to you last year I note that much of it could be repeated tonight unaltered. The Council continues to provide facilities at Mill Lane Pavilion and at the Community Centre in Brook End plus the allotments in Everton Road for which there is a waiting list. Both halls are now used to a greater extent. A new storage area has been constructed at the Pavilion which houses the equipment of the pre school play group. This together with the CCTV has been funded by the generosity of Potton Consolidated Charities.

The football pitches are well used and are standing up to the constant use extremely well. The play areas both at Mill lane and at the Henry Smith Playing Field are a considerable asset well used by the young people of Potton.

Last year I referred to the pride we take in the well maintained cemetery in Sandy Road which compares favourably with all others in the District. I mentioned then how indebted we were to the cemetery caretaker Mick Whittle. He maintained the high standard to which we were accustomed until his retirement last month. His work was appreciated by the large number who attended the farewell party in the Community Centre when suitable gifts were presented and an appreciation given by the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee Eric Jakes.

Mick has been succeeded by Alan Litchfield who appears to be settling in to the role very well.

The caretakers of both Mill Lane and the Community Centre Ann Debenham and Sarah Williamson continue to maintain the premises to a high standard and Sarah has now taken on extra duties as assistant to our clerk Val Moles.

Since the office has been situate in the Community Centre our Clerk is visited by far more people than hitherto, and as her workload has increased (partly due to more services being delegated to Towns and Parishes) it has become necessary for Val to receive assistance. Sarah is now dealing, inter alia, with Hall Bookings.

In the background a great deal of maintenance work is carried out by Peter Stonebridge our extremely handyman.

Last year I said that I was hopeful that by now the Town Centre Enhancement would have been completed. Delays have occurred due to the requirements of the District Council in relation to the management of funds for the work after that Council ceded management of the scheme to us. In addition County Council Highways Department and their contractors Amey had to determine where the work would fit into their schedule. I am pleased that our consultants having taken on board concerns arising from the earlier exhibition of the proposed alterations are now preparing revised drawings and a further display to be accompanied by an article in the Newsletter.

I have to pay tribute to the Party on Potton Committee who last summer put on several days activities and entertainment which attracted people from miles around.

Once again the Twinning Committee master minded the Christmas Lights which added a magical touch to our fine Georgian Square.

It certainly seems that the demands on the Council to provide for the Town become greater each year. Last year we had to take on the provision of Public Conveniences. This year we have incurred more expense in relation to the running costs of CCTV at Mill Lane and will very shortly meet the cost of the provision of a Police Community Support Officer. Ideally the police should provide for the Town's needs from their own resources. Due to the lack of funding from Central Government to ensure adequate policing your Council agreed it is necessary to meet the extra cost. Due to careful management it is noteworthy that the Town's precept for 2007/08 remains unchanged from the previous year at £105,000.

I am sorry that from this year's Council there will be three not seeking re-election. Jane Singleton resigned some three months ago, neither Tim Mason nor Simon Kimber are seeking re-election. I thank all three for their input to our deliberations and in particular to Simon who chaired Finance & General Purposes and Buildings & Facilities Committees.

I am appreciative of the support of all Council members, but in particular Jeremy Armond, Vice-Chairman and Chairman of the Planning Committee, Eric Jakes, Chairman of the Cemetery Committee and doyen of the council, whose experience is of inconsiderable benefit. I also appreciate the work of Mick Allen who has chaired the Playing Fields & Environment Committee since Tim Mason withdrew due to business pressures.

It would indeed be remiss of me if I did not publicly acknowledge the help and great support I have received from Anita both in Council and in relation to outside events I attended as the Town's Representative.

I allude earlier to Val's work load having increased in the last year so that she now has an assistant. She has served us efficiently, carrying out her duties with little fuss, whatever untoward events occurred. We are fortunate to benefit from her input that helps to ensure we deserve our status as a Quality Council.


### Climate – it's the pace of change that should concern us

It is not unusual for the earth's average temperature to rise or fall over tens of thousands of years. However, climate scientists consider it 'very likely' that global warming is now being accelerated by the high volumes of man-made carbon dioxide (CO2) in our atmosphere.

The ten warmest years on record have all occurred since 1995. Computer models explain this pace of warming only when man-made CO2 is taken into account.

Whilst scientists predict that rapid climate changes will cause global difficulties in adapting, energy saving is something positive we can all do to prolong the availability of finite natural resources which will help us to adapt. Reducing CO2 emissions is as straight-forward as insulating our homes, switching off lights and taking our foot off the accelerator.

## **Potton Town Centre**

REVISED PROPOSALS FOR MARKET SQUARE

#### Introduction

You are invited to consider revised proposals for the enhancement of Potton Market Square. These proposals have been prepared with the support of the Potton Town Centre Partnership (TCP), which comprises councillors from Potton Town Council, Bedfordshire County Council, Mid Beds District Council and representatives of local traders.

## What has happened in the past two years?

In the summer of 2005 proposals for the enhancement of the market square were subject to extensive public consultation but they were not supported, principally because of the loss of parking spaces.

Following a decision by Mid Beds District Council (MBDC) to withdraw from the direct management of the project it was necessary for the Town Council to prepare a 'business plan' to secure MBDC approval for the release the funds for the proposals.

As a result of these administrative changes there was an unavoidable delay in progress with the design and planning of the scheme. The design process was reactivated by the TCP and was focussed on the results of the consultation which took place in 2005.

Considerable efforts have been made to review the design from first principles and numerous ideas and options were considered and discussed by the TCP and with the County Council and their Safety Audit team. This took about a year and the design was reconsidered and agreed by the TCP in light of this comprehensive review.


The proposals now put forward are considered to be the best possible solution that maximises car parking whilst improving facilities for pedestrians and achieves a significant environmental enhancement within the budget available.

## Essential requirements

The proposals must meet the requirements of the County Council in terms of highway safety and future maintenance. In practical terms this means:


- 'Head on' parking along the northern side of the square cannot be included;
- The bus stop must stay on the northern side of the square. This was confirmed following an on-site experiment in November 2006 and discussions with the Police;
- Crossing points must be provided to improve pedestrian safety whilst crossing to the central island and around the perimeter of the square. These must be designed so as to reduce the distance from kerb to kerb and include dropped kerbs and tactile paving;
- The size and shape of the central island needs to allow for manoeuvring by large vehicles
- The layout should discourage unauthorised parking where this would interfere with vehicle movements and safety.

In addition, as about half of the funding for this scheme has been secured from developers of other sites in Potton this money must be spent on enhancing the town centre or improving facilities for public transport and cycles.



## Main proposals

- Footway widened in macadam construction and resurfaced in macadam to match widening
- Pedestrian 'dropped crossing points' with tactile paving
- Enlarged central area resurfaced in resin bound gravel aggregate
- Porous resin bound gravel aggregate surfacing for existing tree surrounds
- Parking bays repositioned and surfaced in asphalt
- Parking bays raised to pavement level to allow occasional extension of pedestrian use and surfaced in buff coloured concrete setts



- Bus shelter (design to be agreed)
- Milepost refurbished and relocated close to original position
- Post box relocated
- Semi mature trees with porous tree surrounds
- Bull Street made 'no-entry' from Market Square (except cycles)
- (12) 'Contraflow' cycle lane
- Carriageway resurfaced

#### **DESIGN CONCEPTS**

The design proposal for the market square:

- gives more space to pedestrians by widening the footways in front of the shops
- enlarges the central island to allow more room for occasional markets and events
- provides pedestrian crossing points away from parked cars
- retains car parking, but locates it to improve the views into and across the square
- re-positions wine press, provides new cycle parking and replaces litter bins and seats.

#### **CAR PARKING**

The amount of car parking spaces is sufficient for 44 cars. This is about 3 spaces less than at present. The reduction of numbers is necessary to allow better crossing places to be created for pedestrians. The widening of footways does not reduce car parking spaces.

If the improvements to crossing places were to be provided on their own there would still need to be a reduction of at least 3 parking spaces.

#### LOADING

One of the issues considered by the TCP is whether some parking bays should be made available for deliveries to shops for part of each day – possibly between 8.00 and 10.00. As part of this consultation we are seeking views about whether this would be supported and if so whether there is a preferred location.

#### Attend the exhibition

There will be a public exhibition of the proposals in the Community Centre on Brook End which can be viewed during normal opening hours (9.00 am to 1.00pm on Monday to Wednesday). In addition representatives of the design team and the Town Centre Partnership will be present in the Community Centre on the following dates to discuss the proposals and answer questions.

#### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?


The comments made during this public consultation will be considered by the TCP and any changes will be agreed. If the scheme is approved by the Town Council there are a number of actions necessary before the works can begin:

- Detailed design and specification of the works will be completed;
- A Listed Building application will be made to Mid Beds District Council to relocate the milepost; and
- Bedfordshire County Council will advertise any necessary amendments to the parking and waiting restrictions.

Subject to all the necessary approvals being obtained it is anticipated that the works will begin on site in April 2008 and will be substantially completed by the end of June.

## What happens if agreement cannot be reached?

If no agreement can be reached on the proposals it is anticipated that Mid Beds District Council will withdraw their funding for the scheme and the money raised from developers will be returned to them thereby leaving the Market Square in its current state. Any improvements, such as resurfacing pavements will need to await funding from the County Council.
