## **Outgoing Chairman's message**

Hello and welcome to the June 2021 edition of the Town Council quarterly newsletter.

As we slowly and cautiously emerge from what seems to have been a very long and difficult Winter of Covid restrictions, it is particularly pleasing to see some tentative steps towards normality. It is tempting in this Chairman's message to bemoan all the things that we could not do during lockdown but instead I am going to celebrate the things that we could do and the brilliant community spirit that lives and thrives in our beautiful town.

The lockdown proved to be a challenge to many and I must again give a special mention to Potton Community Support Group. This band of volunteers has continued to give valuable assistance to many of our residents over the past year.

You can read more about what was done and how it was achieved on page 10 of this newsletter.

Three other community projects have managed to thrive throughout the lockdown.

The Potton Food Garden on Myers Road has transformed a piece of rough ground into a tidy working allotment thanks to the hard work of volunteers and kind donations from local people and establishments. The allotment will be completely organic and will be available for use by a range of people throughout Potton including schools as well as organisations supporting disadvantaged or otherwise challenged residents. If you fancy 'having a go' or even if you are on the allotment waiting

list and want to keep your hand in, please contact Potton Town Council staff to find out how to get involved.

**Potton Community Orchard** is being developed under the careful and skilled guidance of Sally Wileman and her team of volunteers. This also is completely organic and contains a range of different fruit trees and shrubs. It is hoped that it will be ready to receive visitors within the next year.

Potton Community Garden on Meeting Lane has brightened up the pathway between Carters Lane and King Street. Thanks to Councillors Carol Leggatt, John Day and their team of volunteers for setting this up and tending the beautiful flowers and plants. The Four Seasons Market scheduled for March was postponed until April to allow more stalls to participate with the gradual relaxing of restrictions. We were blessed with a beautiful sunny morning and it was a pleasure to be able to welcome many of our 'regulars' as well as some newcomers to the market. It continues to be a popular event with stallholders and residents. The next Four Seasons Market will be on Saturday 19th June.

Potton Hall for All is now tantalisingly close to breaking ground. Community support was obtained to allow Potton Town Council to apply for permission to seek borrowing approval from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government for a loan towards the cost of building this facility. More details will be given in the Hall for All report on page 14.

Potton Neighbourhood Plan, having been approved and adopted by Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC), is now a live document and the next challenge is to ensure that aims and objectives of the plan are put into effect and not just remain a plan. This is a community plan, and the community needs to ensure that this happens under the guidance of Potton Town Council. Your help is needed!

Integral to the Neighbourhood Plan is the Potton Green Wheel. This ambitious project to provide a network of footpaths, bridleways and cycleways around the town has got to the stage where we need to go out to public consultation before proceeding further. More details about the Green Wheel on pages 16 and 17.



#### **Potton Tennis Club,**

who are currently located at The Hollow, have now secured the necessary funding and planning permission to be able to construct new tennis courts at Mill Lane Recreational Ground. It is hoped that construction will start this Summer and will result in a much more attractive (and less fragrant!) venue for this popular sport. The courts will also be available

for public hire outside of the times when the Tennis Club are using them.



Potton Town Council were initially planning to launch the **Potton Young People's Town Council (PYPTC)** in May 2020. This is an initiative to encourage more participation by the youth of our town to enable them to air their views and give suggestions about what their section of society would like to see developed in Potton.

This initial start date had to be postponed and we are now hoping to have a new start date of September this year. This is an ideal opportunity for community-minded youngsters to get involved and to have an influence. Parents – please encourage your children to get involved in this exciting project. More information is available on the back page.

Potton Town Council is engaging with CBC to formulate a **Community Safety Plan.** This plan will allow Potton Town
Council to highlight areas of concern
that it becomes aware of so that CBC
can direct the appropriate officers to
investigate and resolve the issues. These
can be as minor as dog fouling, parking
or noise nuisance through to more serious
issues such as anti-social behaviour,
trespass or speeding. This is part of a
continuing drive to ensure that Potton
remains an attractive and safe town for all
residents. **Read more on page 9.**

A candidate for the Town Council is qualified if at the time of nomination, they are:

- 1. a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the EU
- 2. are at least 18 years of age
- **3.** meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
- Are on the list of electors for the town or during the last twelve months you:
- occupied land or property in Potton as owner or tenant.
- had your principle place of work here.
- lived in, or within three miles of Potton.



#### A Town Councillor is unpaid and gives their time for free to the community on a voluntary basis.

Any interested parties must make an application in writing to the Town Clerk, Mr Jonathan Whitehurst at Potton Town Council, The Community Centre, Brook End, Potton, Bedfordshire, SG19 2QS by 9am on Tuesday 22nd June 2021 and include the following information:

- **1.** reason for wishing to be a Councillor;
- 2. previous Community/Council work;
- 3. other skills you can bring to the Council.

## **New Rector for St Mary's**


Hello everyone. Alex Wheatley here, the new Rector for a team of churches which includes St. Mary's Church in Potton, All Saints Church in Sutton and St. John's in Cockayne Hatley. I was pleased to write a short piece for the last Town Council Newsletter and I've been invited back to offer a fuller introduction.

I was licensed to this new post at a service on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2021. This took place at St. John's, Cockayne Hatley, but the majority of the congregation joined us online via zoom. It was a good start to my ministry here and I really appreciated all the hard work that enabled it to happen.

Before being licensed here I was the Assistant Curate to Christ Church, Skipton and St. Mary's, Carleton in Craven. (A Curate is a sort of 'apprentice vicar'). Christ Church is based south of the town centre and serves the southern part of the area. St. Mary's is based in the village of Carleton in Craven which is to the South of Skipton. Both churches have links to Church of England schools and it was great to regularly work with them.

It has been a busy few months what with Easter and figuring things out here. It has also been difficult to get to know the congregations and the area with COVID-19 restrictions still in place. However, I hope that it will soon be possible for me to get to know people a bit better. In any case, I'm pleased to be here and look forward to working with people across the town and district.

## **Community Safety**

Since 2011, the Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has been working with other groups (including police, fire and rescue, probation and social services) on improving community safety.

Potton Town Council (PTC) has been asked by CBC to help develop strategies to use engagement, prevention and, if necessary, enforcement to enhance local community safety. Potton Town Council is therefore looking for input from you (Potton residents, people working in Potton and business owners) so we can gain an up-to-date understanding of current long-term community safety issues (recurring anti-social behaviour, nuisance or criminality) affecting Potton. In addition to ensuring all antisocial behaviour, nuisance and criminality is reported to appropriate authorities. please let us know which long-term community issues you feel we should consider. You can contact us (PTC details below).

For on-going anti-social behaviour, nuisance and criminality, it is important to report these through the correct channels. Even reporting minor incidents can help to build a pattern of criminality that can be acted upon.

## **Potton Community Support Group**

## **Thank you Potton**


#### Well, what a year we have had!

The Potton Community Support Group was formed in March 2020 with a remit to support Potton residents throughout the pandemic. Our first meeting was in Number One King Street and we agreed our plan of action. Starting with donations from Potton Town Council and Potton Consolidated Charity we set about supporting those Potton residents who were suffering financially due to the lockdown or were vulnerable and thus in isolation. Potton came to the rescue:

- 130 people signed up to our Street Volunteer scheme, shopping for those in isolation, collecting prescriptions and being on call to help when required. This was essential for our elderly and vulnerable residents in the first lockdown. This included liaison with local shops to collect and deliver shopping.
- The lockdown led to many residents being furloughed and, in some cases, financial
  difficulty. With financial support from Potton Town Council and Potton Consolidated
  Charity, we set about assessing and supporting those most in need. We set up a
  JustGiving page to raise fund and over the past year we received an amazing £5,245
  in donations from Potton residents. Unbelievable support.
- In total we have spent £6,931 to date, providing: 54 Food Boxes and 94 Vouchers to help over 20 residents affected financially by the lockdowns.

We also want to thank other organisations who have supported our Potton residents in need:

- The Need Project providing food parcels.
- The Veg Box scheme providing boxes of fruit and veg donated by residents.
- The Potton Good Neighbour Scheme providing support and transport to those in need.



# What you need to know about the Covid-19 vaccination





The Covid-19 vaccination programme is the largest in the history of the NHS. The vaccine is being offered to more and more people in our area every week.

Vaccines can reduce or even eliminate some diseases, if enough people are vaccinated.

Since vaccines were introduced, diseases like smallpox and polio that used to kill or disable millions of people are gone from the UK

#### How do vaccines work?

Vaccines teach your immune system how to protect you from diseases. It's much safer for your immune system to learn this through vaccination than by catching the diseases and attempting to fight them.

#### Can I catch Covid-19 from the vaccine?

No. You cannot catch Covid-19 from taking the vaccine but having the vaccine could stop you from becoming seriously ill if you catch the infection.

## Should I be concerned about the speed the vaccine was made available?

The speed in which the vaccines have been developed does not mean that they are unsafe. The technology used to develop the vaccine is not new. It's been tried and tested for decades. It is with this technology and massive global investment to develop a Covid-19 vaccine that has allowed it to be available so quickly.

Any coronavirus vaccine that is approved must go through lots of clinical trials and safety checks, like all other licensed medicines, before it is approved. The Covid-19 vaccines used in the UK have been declared as effective by the UK's independent Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulator (MHRA) after extensive trials.

#### When will I be able to get vaccinated?

The NHS will announce when different age groups can book their vaccination, you can check who is eligible at any time and book your appointment online at **www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination.** You can also book appointments by calling 119.

You may also receive an invitation to book your vaccination from your GP and you can book an appointment directly with them.

# Potton Green Wheel Public Consultation

Central Bedfordshire Council is asking the local community to have their say on proposals for a 'green corridor' around Potton.

The Potton Green Wheel Development Group consisting of representatives from Central Bedfordshire Council, Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity (BedsRCC), Potton Town Council and Sutton Parish Council have worked together to create plans for a Potton 'Green Wheel' which will circuit the town, providing a green corridor for Potton and Sutton residents to enjoy.

The draft plans show that the Green Wheel could provide an important landscape and biodiversity resource for the town to enjoy and encourage walking and cycling both around and in and out of the town.

The Council would now like to hear the community's views on the proposals.

The public consultation began on Monday 24th May and runs until Monday 5th July 2021.



While it might be argued I have too much time on my hands, I hope people will take a minute to remind themselves where the bins are, and will be encouraged to walk a few extra metres to use them.

The map has highlighted areas where we could do with some new bins, and I am speaking to Central Bedfordshire Council to establish if it is possible to install them. Please get in touch with any suggestions on where to locate a new dog, or litter, bin.

The CBC website say dog waste can "be bagged and put into litter bins or taken home and put into your black wheelie bin" so there is no excuse not to pick up, and certainly no reason to leave dog poo bags hanging in bushes.



#### Have your say: Electric vehicle charge point consultation

CBC is asking for your views about onstreet Electric Vehicle (EV) charge point locations across Central Bedfordshire as part of a campaign to increase the uptake of EVs.


I am keen to see more EV points across Potton Ward and hope to see a workable solution for residents who do not have a drive or garage.

Hello and welcome to the first of a regular newsletter feature about improving the environment around the town.

As Chair of the Town Council's Environment Committee, I'm mindful that many residents may not be aware of the number of initiatives being run by volunteers with the active support of your town councillors. Here is a brief summary, but look out for more details on the town council website, Facebook page and future newsletters.



#### **Potton Recycling Scheme**

(co-ordinated by Jill White)

This was established in 2019 to recycle items not currently accepted in household recycling bins. Everything we collect is recycled by Terracycle and raises funds for the Potton Hall for All. The recycling bins are next to the Town Council Offices in Brook End. See the Facebook page and labels on the bins for what we accept.

#### **Potton Food Garden**

(co-ordinated by CBC Cllr Tracey Wye and Sharon Mey)

The aim of the garden is to promote health and wellbeing, by growing healthy food, a proportion of which will be donated to Potton residents facing food poverty. As we begin to come out of lockdown, the garden is once again able to welcome volunteers.





#### **Potton Footpaths Garden**

(co-ordinated by Cllrs Carol Leggatt and John Day)

Meeting Lane is a popular route into town and we have been working with residents to improve its appearance, planting a variety of shrubs and herbaceous plants along the borders. As Covid restrictions lift, we plan to arrange more group sessions.

#### **Potton Community Orchard**

(co-ordinated by Sally Wileman)

The Community Orchard continues to grow as a haven for wildlife and people. In the spring diggers altered the shape of the bank of the brook as a gentler slope is better for wildlife. At the end of last year, volunteers sowed the meadow with wildflowers. Hopefully they will put on a great show this summer.





#### **Open Space off Hutchinson Rise**

There's still work to do in order to make this a safe and attractive area, which is why residents are unable to access the open space yet. The developer, Keir, is aiming to complete this work as soon as possible. The Town Council is liaising closely with them to make sure this happens.

#### **Grass Cutting**

(co-ordinated by Cllr John Day)

The contractors are mowing the parks and verges in the town again, with detailed maps telling them how to cut each patch to allow plants to flower. Below trees in Henry Smith Playing Fields will be left long, but cut every 6 to 8 weeks. The triangle at the end of King Street will be uncut for 8 to 10 weeks from around the end of May to allow flowers to grow.





#### **Nature in Potton**

Carthagena County Wildlife Site

Last year the Town Council published a leaflet guide for the butterfly walk along Carthagena Bridleway. To get the most of it for butterflies its best to visit from late June to mid-July. You can download the leaflet from the Town Council website. Getting this route declared a County Wildlife Site was one of the aspirations of the Potton Neighbourhood Plan.

#### **Swifts**

They'll be back in and around the town now. You can record them on Swift Mapper - (www.swiftmapper.org.uk), where you see them flying at roof top level and entering a nest.

They are hard to see entering nests, this is why - short of standing in the Market Square 24/7, we've yet to confirm breeding in the boxes beneath the clock tower. We know sparrows are using one box but if you see swifts entering any boxes, please email the Town Council who will pass the information on.

Swift mapper is available on both desktop and mobile phone, so you can easily record what you see while in the town. The best times to see them entering nests is just before dusk.



In the past year swift and bat boxes have been fitted into the new Foundry Place development off Willow Road and the Copsewood development off Mill Lane. Swift boxes have also been fitted into the new petrol station development currently under construction on Biggleswade Road.

I was asked by my granddaughter, Imogen 'What is a Town Council and what does it do? Are children involved? Why not?'

After this, I provided a written motion to request that the Town Council consider having a Council for Children. At the meeting it was resolved that a... Working Group investigate a PYPTC and then provide a proposal.

The Town Council members met to talk about how we might spark the interest of our young community to have their say in what they would like in the town. We are looking for about 12 children to form a 'council', ranging in age from school Year 5 through to Year 13. Membership will be open to children resident and/or attending a school and/or organisation in Potton.

Being an active member will give individuals the opportunity to develop key skills including communication, leadership, teamwork, professionalism and fundraising. Many of these skills, as well as making a positive contribution to the community, are both rewarding and recognised as crucial skills by employers.

Members of the PYPTC will also enjoy a range of activities and make useful contacts in the community. They will learn about future opportunities to become an elected Councillor or to develop a career within politics, local government and the voluntary and community sector.
