Community Safety

Since 2011, the Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has been working with other groups (including police, fire and rescue, probation and social services) on improving community safety.



A recent email received by Potton Town Council from police highlighted the importance of reporting issues around community safety: 'matters do need to be reported by calling 101 or via the webchat system so that we capture crime and have a true picture of the scale of the issue, as well as ensuring that offences and crimes have been reported accordingly'.

What to report:

If you witness something you think could be a criminal offence (e.g. burglary, drug dealing), something related to on-going issues (e.g. anti-social behaviour) or suspicious activity; other community safety issues (e.g. dog fouling, fly tipping).

Recording a crime with police will generate a reference (CAD) number. The complainant should keep a copy of the reference so that, if they wish to get back to the police concerning the crime, the record can be found quickly and an update given.

Our Police and Crime Commissioner has undertaken to ensure that reports are followed up diligently with residents, so it is important to ensure the report includes accurate contact details. Wrong contact details will delay police progress and feedback. The council followed up with police on some claims that feedback was not received by complainants. However, police records showed that attempts to provide feedback had been made, but the complainant was not contactable. Indeed, there are open crime reports at advance stages requiring input as a result.



Dog Fouling

In an effort to encourage more of Potton's dog owners to pick up after their pets during their walks around the town, the Town Council has put up new signage in Henry Smith Playing Fields (HSPF), which has been designed by children in Central Bedfordshire, and a 'poo bag' dispenser on the green fencing at the car park entrance to HSPF.

Down but not out -**Potton Hall for All Community Building Project Update**



As reported in the flier that accompanied the February newsletter, materials and service costs for the Hall building have escalated directly as result of global increase driven by Covid and supply chain issues. As a result, the Joint Steering Group of Potton Town Council and Potton Hall for All charity are working hard on several alternative options to deliver a useable, accessible community space that Pottonians can use and enjoy for sports, arts and community activities.

We are:

- asking our Architects to consider a building redesign which can be achieved with the money already secured (c.£1.800.000)
- consulting with representatives of the major users of the building to find a viable solution if we must change our original design
- continuing to seek major funding through grants/trusts including a resubmission via CBC UK Gov Levelling Up Fund
- running community events to raise money for the project and the design preparation stage to continue the dialogue with residents on the need for a bigger community building
- asking Central Bedfordshire Council for a little more time to revise our plans and for an opportunity to discuss potential changes with the Planning Department

Update from Central Bedfordshire Councillor Tracey Wye

It's been three years since I was elected to Central Bedfordshire Council and I am so glad I have this opportunity to represent our ward. Every day brings something new to my desk, from the day-to-day stuff such as potholes, flytipping or helping residents get a meaningful response from the council, to the less obvious such as influencing policies and planning, and sitting on committees.

One more satisfying parts of the job, which brings immediate benefits to our community, is helping groups access the Ward Councillors' Grant scheme and I am pleased to say that all last year's money was allocated to some great projects across the ward. Applications for this vear's funding are now being taken for a share of £4,000 in grants - that's £2,000 per councillor. So if you have a group, or project, in mind which works to benefit the community please get in touch. The money can only be spent on capital expenses i.e. buying things rather than time or services, and some grants can be given without match funding.

For bigger projects to restore/repair/ improve community buildings there is the Community Asset Grant. Please get in touch to discuss your application.

The invasion of Ukraine has been terrible to witness and many people in Potton have wanted to help those fleeing the war zone. I have helped establish Ukraine Response: Potton, an online resource for people who are hoping to host Ukrainian refugees, or can offer practical help and support. The group is on Facebook at www.facebook.com/groups/ **ukraineresponsepotton**. We ask only

people who intend to host or get actively involved sign up to this closed group.

Lastly, I carried out an unofficial survey to measure the local appetite for creating separate cycle paths from Potton to our neighbouring towns and villages. The route from Potton to Sandy is moving on nicely with support from Central Bedfordshire Council and other agencies, and is in a good position to become reality. Linking this to Biggleswade through the RSPB bridleway should be fairly straightforward, and I am working on routes between Potton-Sutton-Biggleswade.



My survey was to see how people would feel about a cycle path to Gamlingay. There were 146 responses; 90 per cent said they would cycle on a dedicated path with others requesting it be usable by pedestrians and horses. The main reasons given for cycling to Gamlingay were leisure/exercise, visiting the farm shop and going to the Eco Hub. While this was a very basic survey, and by no means scientific, it does show there is a healthy appetite for safe cycling which I can use to lobby the council.
