# **HM King Charles III Coronation 2023**



The Town Council is organising an event to help Potton to celebrate the King's Coronation on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Please look through the provisional programme presented on the following pages and we hope to see you at the event.

### HM King Charles III Coronation - Saturday 6th May 2023 At Mill Lane Recreation Ground The big screen will be showing a presentation of previous celebration events in Potton. 9am Potton Youth Council will be selling flags and windmills, plus there will be the opportunity for children to make crowns. All funds raised in aid of Cancer Research for Children at Addenbrookes Hospital, Cambridge. Screening of the live BBC coverage of 'The King's Procession' from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey. 10am\* POP Bar and BBQ open. 11am The Coronation Service at Westminster Abbey. 'The Coronation Procession'. The larger ceremonial procession returning to Buckingham Palace where The King and The Queen 12pm\* Consort, accompanied by Members of the Royal Family, will appear on the balcony to conclude the day's ceremonial events. Posh Picnic with live music and 'Proms in the park'. 2pm Clayton's Hog Roast. Screening of *Encanto*. As part of Potton's Coronation celebrations the Potton Federation Parent Teachers and Friends Association will be presenting a 4pm free family film screening of Encanto on the big screen. 



### **Henry Smith Playing Fields**

We have kept you informed, both before and after, about the various works undertaken in the playing fields in 2022 through articles in the February, July and October 2022 editions of the newsletter. For many years residents have wanted to see Horse Brook dredged and a local contractor was finally able to carry out the work in 2022. Construction vehicles clearly had to access the playing fields to undertake the work. So far this is what has been accomplished in 2022:

### Spring

- 1. Initial dredging of Horse Brook
- 2. Construction of a ford style crossing to allow vehicular access from the South Field to the North Field

### **Autumn**

- **3.** Further dredging of Horse Brook
- 4. Replacement Headwall and reconstruct sluice bed
- 5. Screening of topsoil
- **6.** Reprofiling of Potton Brook
- 7. Reprofiling next to Millennium Path

The Spring work had to be completed in advance of the Platinum Jubilee, and to undertake Items 3. 4 and 5 the Horse Brook needed to have very little or no water in it. Also to avoid clashing with the Party on Potton Weekend, making the whole North field available for community use, work recommenced in the Autumn.








Since the completion of this work we have received feedback, both positive about the brook and negative about the condition of the playing fields. Whilst we generally agree that work will be required to improve the field it was not possible to dredge without temporary damage to the field and we do ask people to not verbally abuse the town council staff or councillors when expressing their views on this.

As well as the brook the town council has received many requests about levelling and resurfacing the Millennium Path, with residents commenting that the existing path is uneven. We advised on page 26 of the July 2022 newsletter 'The town council is investigating resurfacing of the Millennium path with either tarmac or a rubber and stone aggregate, which is

bound with polyurethane binder.' Also in that edition, we asked for your opinion on the installation of surface level lighting on the Millennium Path and all responses received were in favour of such lighting.

So the town council wants to gauge your opinion about the replacement of the Millennium Path. The proposal is that the whole existing path is removed and replaced; the height of the path between the car park and the bridge is raised, and soil is added next to the path to allow easy access from the path to the field. However as this is a major project we would like vour input on the following:



### Volunteering

Monday 8th May has been designated the Big Help Out Day as part of the Coronation celebrations. To encourage Potton (and other) residents to try volunteering and support our local area. our Coronation-day celebrations will include opportunity for local organisations to promote themselves and recruit help. Potton is already a great community for people looking out for one-another, but often opportunities and availability of help can pass us by. ### Life Saving

The town now sports four outdoor defibrillators with the possibility of more being installed over the next year. Nobody likes the idea of needing to use one, never mind needing one used on them - but should the need arise. it's best to be prepared. The town council has therefore arranged for **defibrillator** training at the Community Centre at **5pm on Wednesday 17th May.** The timing is to help (and encourage) local business employees attend after work. Training is being organised by Carlton Avison.



### **Community Safety**

The town council has been discussing with Bedfordshire Police to examine how best to address local problems of antisocial behaviour, bullying as well as more wide-spread crime (speeding, catalytic converter theft, county lines drug dealing), which unfortunately is becoming more pervasive in Potton. We are looking for volunteers from our community to join the police Watch Schemes. For Speed **Watch,** volunteers monitor the speeds of travelling vehicles. Local locations are selected when highlighted by residents

as speeding hotspots and these are included for monitoring subject to a police risk assessment. Street Watch provides an opportunity for you to help keep Potton safe while walking around your neighbourhood by engaging with residents and encouraging people to report suspicious or anti-social behaviour. Dog and Horse Watch schemes can

operate in a similar way. Scheme members are asked to provide at least 2 hours 'watching' activity per month. For further detail, please contact WatchSchemes@ beds.police.uk or see a councillor at one of the monthly surgeries in the Market Square. In addition, police have informed the council that they are keen to recruit special constables and that these can now be dedicated to particular areas (i.e. Pottonian SCs for Potton). More information is available at https://www.beds.police.uk/ search?q=special+constable.



### **Community Energy**

The council has recently formed a Community Energy Working Group. We aim to set up sustainable energy projects in and around Potton. Our objectives are for residents to benefit from cheaper energy, reduced energy needs and to contribute to the UK NetZero programme. The working group would welcome help and advice from residents who are expert in solar/wind/hydro/other (non-nuclear, obviously) sustainable energy generation, heat pumps, improvement of house insulation or accessing government and other funds.
