A candidate for the Town Council is qualified if at the time of nomination, they are:

- 1. a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the EU
- 2. at least 18 years of age
- **3.** meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
- Is on the list of electors for the town or during the last twelve months you:
- occupied land or property in Potton as owner or tenant.
- had your principle place of work here.
- lived in, or within three miles of Potton.

A Town Councillor is unpaid and gives their time for free to the community on a voluntary basis.

Any interested parties must make an application in writing to the Town Clerk, Mr Jonathan Whitehurst at Potton Town Council, The Community Centre, Brook End, Potton, Bedfordshire, SG19 2QS **by 9am on Friday 18th August 2023** and include the following information:

Outgoing Chairman's message

A fond farewell from outgoing Chairman Cllr John Hobbs

Firstly, I'd like to welcome Cllr Jonathan Price Williams as Chairman of Potton Town Council. Jonathan was Vice-Chairman during my two years as Chairman, and together we worked as a team to support the council in fulfilling its function and improving the infrastructure of the town. I know that Jonathan will be a good leader of this council. I'd also like to thank all members of Potton Town Council for their hard work and enthusiasm, providing much needed services for the town.



During my two years as Chairman, amongst many things, the Council has:

- Established the Potton Food Garden, which supports the Veg Box Scheme.
- Formed a Potton Youth Council, providing a welcome voice from our younger residents.
- Formed a Community Safety Working Group, liaising with Central Bedfordshire Council and Bedfordshire Police.
- Formed Refugee Response Potton, to give much needed support to both our Ukrainian and Myanmar guests and their hosts.
- Organised the much-needed dredging of the Horse Brook and replacing the headwall and constructing a sluice crossing.
- Supported the relocation of Potton Tennis Club to Mill Lane and thus the provision of tennis courts for hire.
- Supported the formation of the Potton Green Wheel, which will hopefully be launched in September.
- Supported the development of a new Community Hall, which will include the provision of indoor sports in the town. Hopefully, this will be built in 2024.

I am also proud of the four-day celebration of our late Queen's Platinum Jubilee that the council organised and funded. This was an amazing achievement for a small town like Potton



and was well supported. It was also good to see Party on Potton return in 2022 after a four-year absence.

The Friendship Group and Tablet Workshop Group celebrated the Coronation with a 'street party' in the Community Centre, which Judi and I were delighted to attend. I would like to thank our Community Agent, Andrea MacAdam and her team of helpers for organising this. Great fun was had by all who attended. Also, many thanks to Phil Wright for providing our musical entertainment. **You can find out more about the Tablet Workshop and Friendship Groups and Andrea's work on page 16.**

My last official duty was at the Coronation Day event, organised by the council's Commemorations and Celebrations Committee. It was well attended considering the wet afternoon, and at least we were able to witness the coronation on the big screen. My thanks also to our Town Crier, Carlton Avison, who announced the event on the Market Square before parading to Mill Lane Recreation Ground.

So, in summary, I'd like to thank the councillors, who have worked so hard over the past two years, devoting much of their free time and energy to improving Potton. We also have a dedicated administration, and I'd like to personally thank them for supporting me as Chairman and for all the work that they do to ensure the smooth running of the council.

Lastly, I'd like to thank my wife, Judi, for her invaluable, dedicated support during my years as Chairman of Potton Town Council.

Potton Green Wheel in Development to Enhance Potton Countryside

A new Green Wheel is being developed in Bedfordshire around Potton and Sutton, expected to be open to the public in Autumn 2023.



This will be the fourth Green Wheel to be launched in Bedfordshire, alongside Biggleswade, Etonbury and Sandy Green Wheels.

A Green Wheel is a multi-use accessible corridor around a community, passing through and beside areas of wildlife, heritage and landscape value. Launched initially as a walking route, it is hoped that the Green Wheel will ultimately cater for cyclists, and where possible horse riders.

There will be access 'spokes' from within the town to the green Wheel 'rim', so people can join onto the Green Wheel at different points and walk, cycle or jog as much as they like.

Jake Kirby, Green Wheel Development Officer from Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity said:

"Working on the development of Potton Green Wheel has been a very exciting journey, and I am pleased that we are able to bring this new project to Potton and Sutton. The Green Wheel will be an important landscape and biodiversity resource for the community to enjoy, and will bring both physical and mental wellbeing benefits to those who use it."

Community Energy



Community energy involves people coming together to reduce energy use and purchase, manage and generate low-carbon heat and power. Community energy projects are delivered by groups of residents working collectively; historically, strong positive community outcomes are achieved. Indeed, success has led to over 500 community Energy groups/companies in the UK with over 275 in England.

In addition to four other areas, Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC), and their partner, Community Energy South (CES), selected Potton to help and advise residents in setting up communityapproaches to reducing heating requirements and obtaining sustainable heating and energy.

CES was established in 2013 as an umbrella organisation and regional hub enabling its members (local community energy groups and community organisations) to grow as sustainable low carbon businesses in the southeast of England. CBC will fund the setting up of a Community Benefit Society and founder members receive CES advice on how to do this and how to then raise funds to deliver projects. CBC are also supporting individual residents with solar panel installation. Potton Town Council has obtained two thermal imaging cameras which are available to residents on payment of a refundable deposit. These cameras are for self-home-energy surveys to assess building efficiency and indicate main areas of heat loss that can then be targeted for improvement by simple means, like curtaining and improved loft insulation, to more complex retrofitting of wall insulation.

Projects identified include a programme of education for interested residents on how they might reduce their heat losses during winter (and – as it happens – heat gains during our hot summers!) and provision of solar energy generation capabilities to the Potton Hall for All. The potential for wind, hydro and geothermal generation of heat and energy is also being actively considered.

Community Safety



Defibrillator Training

Potton is now blessed with five defibrillators around town. They are available to the public 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You must dial 999 to obtain a code to access the defibrillator.

The defibrillators are located outside of Potton Library, Potton Fire Station, Potton Middle School, St Mary's Church Hall, and Potton & District Club & Institute. There is also one further defib located inside Potton Bowls Club.

It is important that a reasonable number of residents and the staff of local businesses are confident and (reasonably) competent in their use.

Potton Town Council organised for Carlton Avison and Tom Shorter from Potton Fire Station to provide training at the Community Centre on 17th May. The session was attended by approximately 30 people, including some from Market Square businesses. Carlton gave a 'no holds barred' talk on what to do, how to do it and what adverse side effects might arise. Tom provided a demonstration using defibrillators and dummy dolls so that they could show how this important equipment should be used.

The use of the defibrillator needs to be done in combination with CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). The machine gives instructions that are easy to follow and will not allow it to deliver an electric shock unnecessarily. However, the primary treatment until a defibrillator can be found is CPR and this should continue until the machine requests a stop and to ensure everyone is standing clear.

If you missed the training session, as it wasn't at a convenient time, and would like to attend one, please contact the town council, who will try to arrange for another session at a different time of the week. Failing that, it is intended that training/retraining will be offered on an annual basis.

A New Dawn

Independent Administration will run Central Bedfordshire Council



At May's meeting of Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC), councillors elected a new administration to run the council. The Executive committee (cabinet), Leader and Chairman, will all be Independent councillors.

At the May local elections, Independents won the highest number of councillors (27), with the Conservatives reduced from 43 councillors to 20, Liberal Democrats winning 10, Labour 5 and Greens 1.

In the weeks after, councillors of all groups were invited to propose members to fill the key positions on the council.

At the AGM, all councillors met, and elected a new chairman, vice chairman, Executive committee, and political leader of the council. All Independents. This is the first time anywhere in the UK that a unitary or county council (i.e., the larger ones) has seen an Independent administration.

We are pleased to tell you Adam was elected by his peers as the new Leader of CBC, and Tracey became an Executive member with responsibility for Sustainability and Climate mitigation.

We are immensely proud for Potton.

This is something we have achieved together.

We as Independents will do things differently:

- No longer will we be taking the full Special Responsibility Allowances claimed by our predecessors.
 We will take one third less, which will save the Council in excess of £110,000 per year.
- No more will all council committee meetings take place solely when the public is at work. We will begin work to move to more evening meetings.
- We have commenced an immediate constitutional reform of the way the council works, in order to make council meetings and procedures more accessible for the public.
- We will begin a forensic review of the council's finances.
- No longer will all the council committee chairman and vice chairman go to the same group. For the first time ever on CBC these have been shared out proportionately between the groups.

We recognise that as a minority administration we need to work with all councillors, and council officers, for the benefit of local residents - that begins now.

We said to councillors at the meeting that we will get it wrong on occasion and in advance we request your understanding. But we will learn, and we aim to make you proud.

This is a new dawn. An Independent dawn.

Are you claiming all the benefits you

are entitled to? – Many people of State Pension age are not claiming the benefits they could be. You may be entitled to Pension Credit if your weekly household income is below £201.05 for a single person or £306.85 for a couple. If you are having difficulty with daily tasks such as washing, dressing and moving around your home then you may be able to claim Attendance Allowance. It is not means tested and you could get up to £101.75 per week to help with care costs.

Tablet Training Group – If you would like to learn how to use emails and the internet and can commit to attending drop-in sessions on Wednesday mornings at the Community Centre then we can provide you with a Samsung tablet and teach you how to do it. Please get in touch for further details. **Thursday Friendship Group** - is held at the Community Centre, Brook End, 10am until 12 noon. The Friendship Group welcomes all for a coffee, cake, a game of cards or dominoes and a chat every Thursday morning. Entry is £3 for unlimited coffee and cake. We held a wonderful Coronation Party in May with Phil Wright playing piano and everyone enjoying a sing-song. In June, we went on a trip to Priory Marina and had afternoon tea on the John Bunyan riverboat whilst cruising along the River Ouse.

Potton Hall for All

Registered Charity number 1158751

The planning application CB/23/01177/FULL for Potton Hall for All was submitted in Spring 2023 and at the time of going to print we have received full permission.

There are a number of conditions that have to be addressed by the Trustees, Town Council and our contractor Watson & Cox before any works can commence. However, we are moving forward with Watson & Cox undertaking the necessary work to get the plans to RIBA stage 2 and provide us with a final fixed price to build, so contracts can be put in place. At the same time we are working with Central Bedfordshire Council to get to the point where we've satisfied their funding requirement and the agreement to release the section 106 money that has been allocated to the Hall is gained.





Hopefully all will come together and allow us to commence works in the Autumn.

The Potton Hall for All will be located beside the Tall Trees housing development, accessible from Hutchinson Rise (off Biggleswade Road), on serviced land owned by Potton Town Council granted as part of the Tall Trees Section 106 agreement.

New Youth Shelter

The town council applied for funding from the Youth Space's Fund 2021/2022, which was available from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC), in conjunction with the Violence Exploitation Reduction Unit (VERU). The Youth Space's Fund 2021/2022, sought to improve shared community environments for young people in Bedfordshire.

The funding awarded helped to fund a new youth shelter in Henry Smith Playing Fields and councillors from Potton Youth Council helped with the decision on the design and colour, and where it should be situated. Local business *Gemmaton* (a bespoke metal work fabricator) designed and installed the shelter in May. There was an official opening of the youth shelter on Monday 3rd July at 6pm. PCC Festus Akinbusoye and the Chairman of Potton Town Council (PTC), Cllr Jonathan Price Williams were in attendance along with Potton Youth Councillors and the Youth Council's facilitators, Cllrs John Day, PTC Vice-Chairman Vicki Gwilliam and Carol Leggatt.
