#### Message from the new Chairman - Cllr Vicki Gwilliam

Welcome to this edition of the Town Council Newsletter. Having served four years on the council, this is my first message as Chairman, and it is an honour to represent our community. The Town Council continues to work hard on behalf of the community, and I am delighted to say that we have filled all councillor vacancies. **Read about the new Councillors on pages 8 and 9.** 



I would like to congratulate **Danni and James Watson** who undertook a **24hour charity bike/run/walk** around town in aid of Petals Charity in May. They set themselves a fundraising target of £5,000 in memory of their daughter Bethan. Petals Charity supports families who have suffered baby loss, and I am delighted that they smashed their target, raising more than £6,000! The Town Council continues to make **improvements to the footpaths** in Potton Cemetery on Sandy Road, and at St Mary's Church. The second phase of works at the Cemetery include the driveway



from the road and the path around the Chapel. There will be a feature on this in the October newsletter.

Following **Potton Youth Council's** fundraising efforts, they have raised the money to buy a **basketball hoop for Henry Smith Playing Fields.** This has been installed in time for the school Summer holidays.

In the April newsletter, **the Youth Council** asked for your opinion on installing **a new assault course at Mill Lane Recreation Ground's play area**. Thanks to those of you who responded. The Youth Council now plans to consult Potton's school children to find out what they would like to see replace the play equipment that is approaching the end of its life. #### **Potton Community First Responders**

Potton Community First Responders (CFR) volunteer for the East of England Ambulance Service (EEAST) in Biggleswade, Potton, Sandy and surrounding areas.

By way of brief explanation, CFRs respond to Category 1 and 2 emergencies, mobilised by EEAST via dedicated mobile phones. Category 1 calls are time critical; CFRs are more often than not first on scene and are trained to administer lifesaving care to our community until the ambulance crew arrive.

The Biggleswade, Potton, Sandy CFRs have only two kits and have been funding raising for a third, which costs around £3,500 for all the different pieces of equipment. Potton's involvement in fundraising for a third kit in May and June has seen donations of over £3,000 (Breedon Group plc £500, Potton Consolidated Charity £500, Potton Town Council £1,000 and PottonFest donations and raffle raised £1,300).

# **Community Safety Traffic Issues in Potton**

Residents of Chapel, Bull and Horslow Streets have long been concerned about heavy goods vehicles using their very narrow streets as an alternative for the B1040. But in February this year, a road closure on Blackbird Street led to exceptionally large volumes of inappropriate traffic (HGVs, lorries, buses etc.) using those streets. Damage to cars, and houses ensued, and in one case a pedestrian was hit by a vehicle driving on the pavement.

Residents from these three streets, with the support of Potton Town Council, set up a meeting with Central Bedfordshire Council's (CBC's) Highways Department to discuss their concerns for these three streets, and Potton in general.

The meeting highlighted that, even at the best of times, Potton's old streets are not well suited for the HGV traffic that regularly uses them. This is exacerbated when road closures occur. Speeding and inconsiderate driving further add to the safety issues.



Officers from CBC's Highways Department walked with residents to see some of the issues first hand and agreed to undertake automated traffic surveys at the entrances to Chapel and Horslow Streets to get better data before considering any further action.

CBC's Highways Department encourage all Potton residents to report any inappropriate or illegal traffic behaviour to the police so that the scale of these issues is better understood, and they can make a case for improvements. So, we ask you please to report any speeding, collisions with vehicles/buildings, and even vehicles mounting pavements. This can be done online: https:// tinyurl.com/PottonTraffic or by phone: 101. Then we can request the changes we need to improve safety in our town.

# **Grass cutting in Potton**

The areas Potton Town Council are directly responsible for are the Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) highway verges, Everton Road Allotments, Henry Smith Playing Fields (HSPF), Mill Lane Recreation Ground, Sandy Road Cemetery, and St Mary's Churchyard. CBC Highways Department pay the Town Council to maintain its verges, but the sum does not cover the costs.

The frequency of cutting for most areas is fortnightly. In addition to weather, which as explained in the April 2025 edition, affects rate of growth, another key factor is soil fertility. Much of Potton is on the Greensand Ridge which as the name suggests, much of the parent soil is sandy and free draining. This helps wash nutrients through the soil which inhibits grass growth. These conditions are ideal for growing wildflowers and importantly reducing the number of times the grass requires mowing. Although quite subtle, this difference can be seen on several of our verges.

The Town Council has managed to adopt cut and collect mowing in some areas, such as parts of St Mary's Church, HSPF and the triangle island at the junction of King Street and Gamlingay Road. The Town Council has considered a wider cut and collect policy but as with elsewhere, disposal of clippings is problematic in the current climate.

# Update from Central Bedfordshire Councillor Adam Zerny

#### Local plan longlist announced - what does it mean for potton?

Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has announced a list of 494 potential housing sites across the region, from which, in a couple of years, a shortlist will be proposed for development in the next Local Plan.

This Local Plan will show where all future housing development will go, in our area. Without a Local Plan, developers can just apply to build wherever they want to, knowing even if the council turns it down, this may get overturned at appeal, as the local authority won't be able to demonstrate they have a plan.

No one would disagree we need homes for the next generation. But what we don't want, is to see is our countryside and wildlife destroyed by ugly new housing developments. When new housing is planned, it's vital residents' views are valued and that we get the right infrastructure.

At the end of last year, the council conducted a legal process known as a 'Call for sites' where people could forward land for the next Local Plan. 626 sites were proposed. Council officers have since evaluated the list, removing any which are obvious candidates for refusal e.g.

- Not big enough for at least 10 new homes
- Land in SSSIs, or the highest flood risk areas
- Land where there is a legal impediment to development e.g. submitted without owner's permission
- Sites not adjacent to a town/village and not big enough to form a new settlement on their own

132 sites have been removed for these reasons (marked in blue on the map - top right).

The council has now put together a website where you can see exactly where the remaining 494 sites are located. The map also shows Green Belt. It is perhaps not surprising that many areas in the west and south of Central Beds have fewer plots of land put forward, as this is where there are large areas of Green Belt.

Of course, the question everyone will want to ask is how many of these sites will eventually be needed?

The council has agreed to provide an extra 25,500 houses by 2050. And it has received proposals of land amounting to about 10,900 hectares.



#### Site unlikely to go ahead

Site for further consideration

This would be likely be enough for 380,000 houses. Which means based upon my reckoning, only about 7% of this land would be required. However, this is NOT a guarantee. On some land a developer may want to build mansions with huge gardens, on another they might want to build tower blocks. Plus, Green Belt rules are stricter, which means areas without Green Belt will be more likely to be allocated housing.

In our area there are many around Potton and surrounding villages. As mentioned above, it is VERY unlikely all of this land will end up on the shortlist.

There are also huge swathes between Everton and Tempsford, much of which could find its way into the government's rumoured new town No one has made any decisions on which sites will be needed, and there will be public consultations on this in 2026 and 2027. It will depend to some extent on the land put forward, but we are arguing it should be about the right homes in the right places, not just the first sites put forward by developers. Council officers will be proactively undertaking work to try to ensure the most suitable sites are selected.

**Are you new to the community?** - if you are looking for groups and activities to get involved in but not sure what's available then contact Andrea who can help you find something you may be interested in.

**Benefits guidance** – you may be entitled to Pension Credit if your weekly income is below £218.15 if you are single or £332.95 if you are a couple. You must both be over State Pension age if you live as a couple.

**Blue Disabled Badges** – if you have a disability or illness which limits your walking ability then you may be entitled to apply for a Blue Badge to enable you to park in a disabled bay. You don't need to be a car owner; the badge is valid in any vehicle as long as you are a passenger.

**Tablet Training Group** – if you would like to learn how to use emails and the internet and can commit to attending drop in sessions on Wednesday mornings between 10am and midday at the Community Centre (Brook End, SG19 2QS) then we can provide you with a Samsung tablet and teach you how to do it. We can also help you learn how to use your new smart phone. Please get in touch for further details.
