However, I would like to commend the efforts of those councillors on the Planning Committee in representing our community, in particular Cllr Charles Craig who spoke at the inquiry on behalf of the Town Council.

Community Police Officer

Community payback team

Community Payback is a court-ordered community sentence in England and Wales where offenders complete a specified number of unpaid work hours to benefit the community, such as removing graffiti or clearing wasteland. Delivered by the Probation Service, the scheme aims to hold offenders accountable for their actions, repay society, and provide them with opportunities for skill development and rehabilitation.

The collaboration between Potton Town Council and the Community Payback Team in Bedfordshire commenced around three years ago and has led to several visits in the late Summer and early Autumn to carry out further maintenance to our town's footpaths.



Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday falls on **9th November** and the town will meet as usual on the **Market Square at 10.10am** for the Service led by the United Churches of Potton, before forming a parade to march to the Cemetery and War Memorial along Sandy Road where the two minutes' silence will be held at 11am followed by the reading of the Roll of Honour.

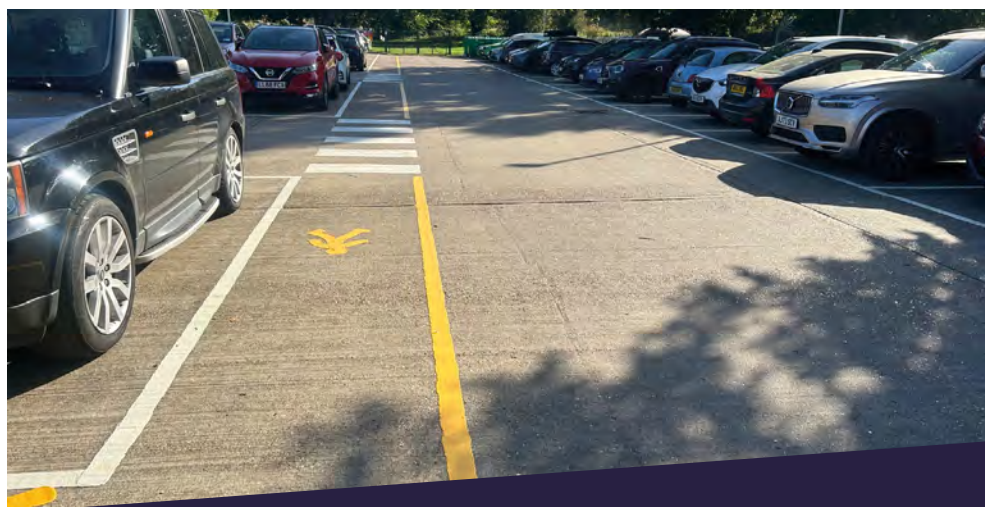
Potton Town Council has been awarded £27,500 from Central Bedfordshire Council through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and Rural England Prosperity Fund. The funding will provide an opportunity to support both new initiatives and ongoing improvements. The town council has been given from September 2025 to March 2026 to deliver the projects.

Several projects have already been delivered in September and October 2025 and these are:

- Making the Henry Smith Playing Field car park safer for pedestrians, especially disabled, elderly and

children by additional marking for a walkway and crossings and remarking of car park spaces.

- The purchase of 24,000 dog bags, which is approximately the number used by dog owners in a twelve month period from the four dog bag dispensers (Henry Smith Playing Fields car park, Henry Smith Playing Fields by Church Causeway, Mill Lane Recreation Ground and outside the Community Centre).
- Replacing of tables and chairs in the Community Centre and Mill Lane Pavilion.
- Additional pages in the October edition of the town council newsletter.



Further projects

Further projects will be delivered before March 2026, which includes a mosaic trail. The objective of the mosaic trail is to enhance public spaces, celebrating local heritage, culture and community identity. The mosaic will be designed and handcrafted by Claire Costello, a professional mosaic artist, in collaboration with local organisations and the wider community. Using high-quality, weather-resistant materials, the mosaics will be a long-lasting feature, bringing vibrancy and artistic value to the area for years to come.

Community Workshops will take place on Friday 21st and Saturday 22nd November from 11am to 3pm at the Community Centre, Brook End, Potton SG19 2QS.

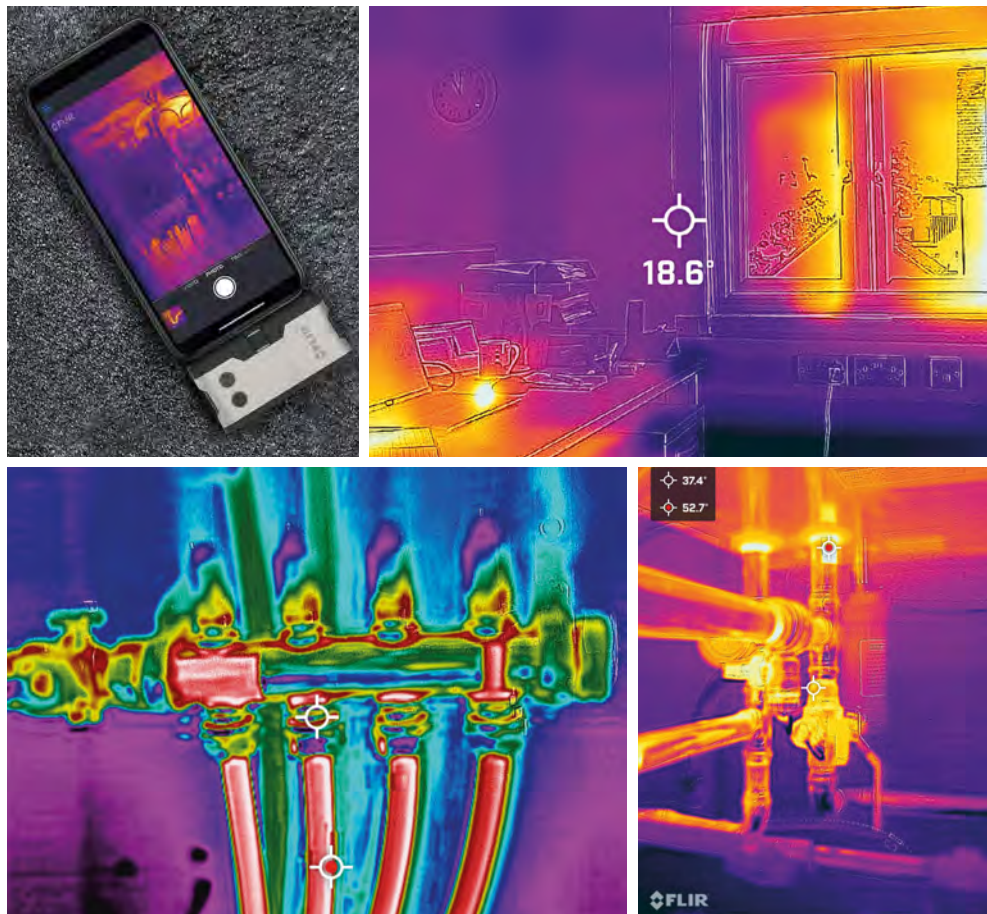

Thermal Image Cameras



With Winter approaching, do you want to find out where your home is leaking heat?

Potton Town Council has two thermal image cameras (one iOS and one Android with lightning adaptors) which can plug into your smartphone for loan to Potton residents. There is no charge to borrow a camera; you just need to pay a £200 deposit, which is refundable after the camera has been returned, and you might consider making a donation to allow for maintenance of the cameras and/or additional cameras to be purchased. Suggested donation of £5.

Potton's Neighbourhood Plan

2025 revision

Our Plan was published in 2019, following a favourable local referendum, and has, along with Central Bedfordshire Council's Local Plan, been used to inform where development should take place and the type and quality of that development.

6 years on it was time to review the effectiveness and content of the plan.

Effectiveness:

Whilst it is true that some developments have been built on sites which were not supported by the Neighbourhood Plan a number of other unsupported planning applications have been rejected. Often the reasons for rejection make reference to statements within the Neighbourhood Plan and so on balance it has probably been beneficial to have the plan in place in order to steer any development in a direction which could be supported by local people.

Content:

Changes were made to bring the plan up to date with revisions to the National Policy Planning Framework (December 2024) and other reference documents.

Development since the creation of the plan has been captured and the sites map updated to show the impact of this development (**see map overleaf**).

Since no changes were made to its Vision, Aims or Policies, the revised plan

has been published and can be found on the CBC website or Town Council website here:

Next steps:

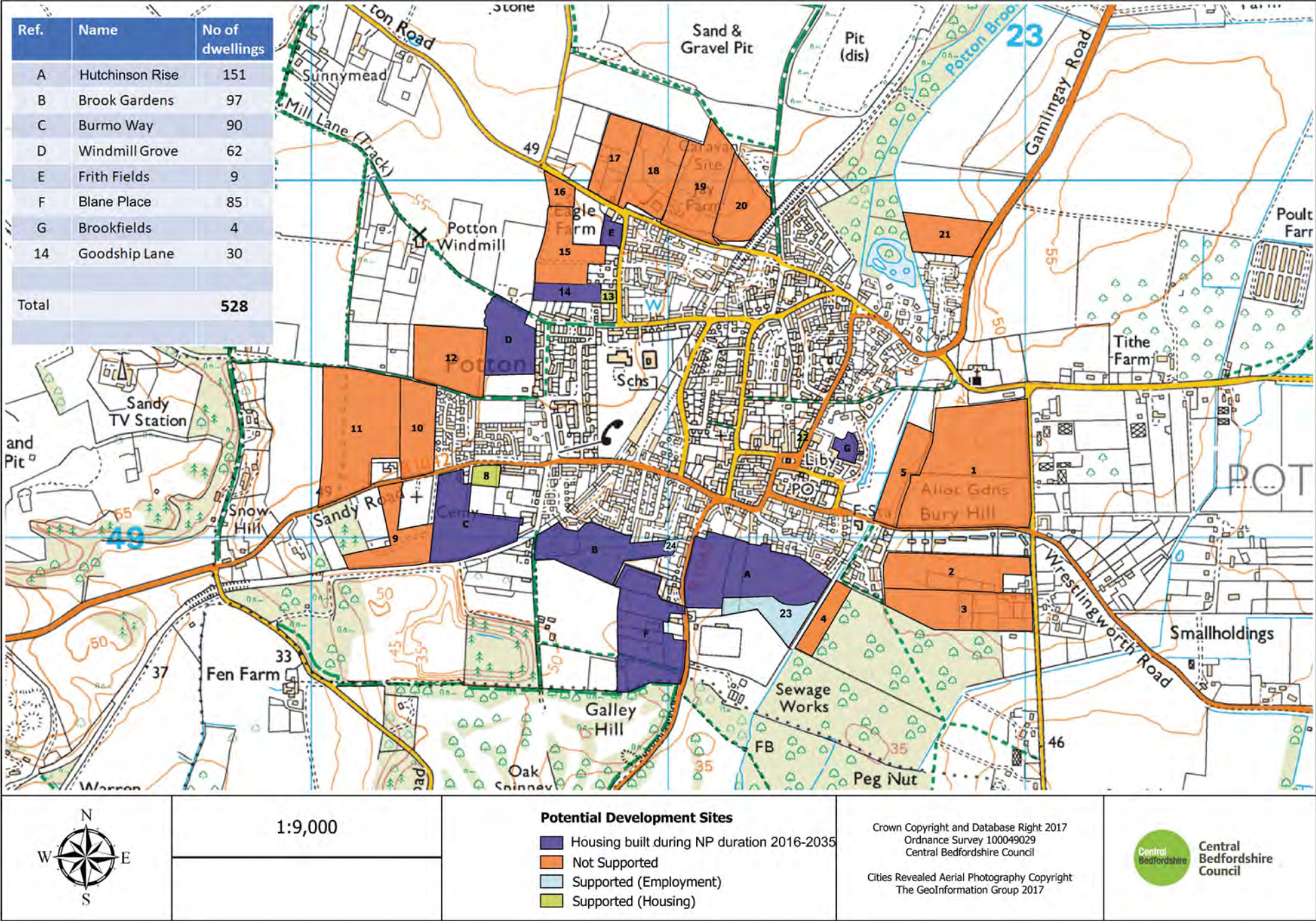

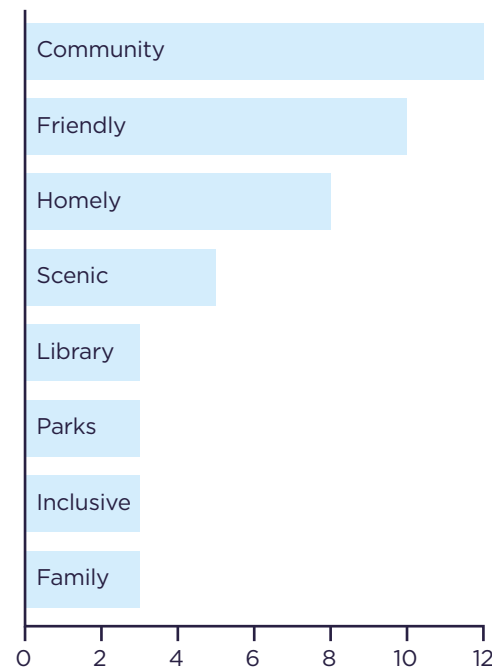
Why Do You Love Potton?

Walk Buddy Scheme

Do you know someone who could benefit from the support of a Walk Buddy to get out and complete a short walk to enable them to be more mobile, confident walking outside and more independent?

- Do they have a health condition that would benefit from going out for a short walk e.g. a cancer diagnosis, recently out of hospital or waiting for an operation, excess weight?
- Are they housebound or isolated?
- Are they not able to access any group exercise – do they have low confidence, lack motivation or are frail?



The Scheme can link the resident with a local person who will meet with them to go for a short walk, following their care plan to build confidence and help improve their health and wellbeing.

A Community Effort to Support Displaced Families

It began as a combined community-driven and Potton Town Council initiative launched in expectation of Ukrainian guests arriving in our town. An action group was formed to explore the best ways to provide a warm welcome and practical support.

Volunteers helped families settle into the community. Friendly gatherings over tea and conversation helped guests feel part of the Potton community. The support of the Central Beds Hub also proved invaluable during this time.

A Rohingya family, refugees from Myanmar, moved to Potton and a new need emerged. The group extended its welcome and support to any displaced refugees settling in our town. This

change brought new opportunities to learn and adapt, as volunteers worked to understand and meet different cultural needs. The family have since moved to Bradford - they left with fond memories of the time volunteers spent with them and the kindness shown here.

Support is ongoing with different families - a family from Syria has recently arrived in Potton. It makes all the difference to their experience of living in a new country to have a warm welcome from our community.
